Safety equipment to be checked before each use and periodically. Any leader considered to be 'in ratio' must be ready and able to enter the water to assist any participants.

Manual handling of canoes All Equipment to only be lifted by enough people. Rafted canoes to be lifted in a controlled manner under supervision
