		 - Any rules/instructions are broken by anyone using the activity. - Weather conditions deteriorate - A person or animal moves towards or across the target area.
Misuse of equipment	All	 Crossbows to be always kept at the shooting line. Participants instructed that they can only use the crossbows and bolts under direct supervision. Crossbows and bolts should be kept always pointing down range and never towards another person. Bolts are counted at the start and the end of the session to ensure all are accounted for. Instructor talks through and demonstrates the correct way to load a crossbow and shoot a bolt. All spare bolts are removed from the shooting line if the instructor leaves the shooting line to aid collection of bolts. Crossbow to be placed upon rest when not in use i.e., whilst person is on range or retrieving bolts Ensure foot is firmly placed inside the stirrup when cocking crossbow; failing to do this could cause the crossbow to slip from underneath the foot during cocking. When cocking crossbow hold the string at equal distances on both the left and right side of the stock to avoid crossbow being cocked unevenly. Never hold the crossbow around the trigger, as this could easily fire the arrow by accident.
Equipment failure – injured by equipment	All	 Equipment checked at regular intervals and recorded by a competent person. Equipment checked prior to every use. Participants must not dry shoot (i.e., discharge a crossbow without and bolt in place) the crossbow. All damage reported to Waddecar Centre Management. Crossbow rail should be lubricated regularly during session Bowstring to be checked regularly during session Safety Glasses to be worn by participants Ensure the safety to the ON position as soon as the weapon is cocked, and before removing the foot from the stirrup. Cocked crossbow, and especially if an arrow is seated, is not place on the ground, as the trigger could engage by accident. If needing to rest the crossbow somewhere, remove the arrow and manually de-cock weapon.
Caught by bowstring	Participants	 Correct shooting technique demonstrated and instructed. Always keep fingers beneath the stock when shooting, and make sure no part of the arm gets in the way of the string.
