		The pond construction limits the maximum water depth to approximately 1.2m.				
		Leaders in charge must be able to always see all the participants.				
		Spectators and participants waiting to enter the pond should be kept away from the bank and kept under control.				
		Maximum two people per kayak.				
		Safety equipment to be checked before each use and periodically.
